In aviation, flexibility is just as important as precision. We all love a calm morning over the Sierra and a smooth cross-country plan to the coast, but sometimes the winds Mother Nature, maintenance, or other uncontrollable factors get in the way. The best pilots don't just cancel, they have backup plans. When you are earning your ratings and looking to add to experience this is very important to keep in mind.

Having a backup plan is more than just a smart move; it's essential to keep your skills building at a steady pace. Maybe your flight to California is blocked by incoming clouds over the Sierra but you could still fly south toward calmer skies around Minden or east toward Hawthorne. Maybe you could stay local and work on performance landings or maneuvers. Whatever the case may be, cancelling outright not only prevents progress for you, it has also blocked another pilot from being able to access the plane during that block.

Be sure to reach out to an instructor as your flight date approaches especially if you have any questions about a go/no-go decision and what good options would be to keep your progress going. It's easy to just stay on the ground but if you are going to truly build your skills you want to keep pushing yourself into new scenarios. Never compromise safety but also realize that a good lesson to learn is that there is always a lesson to learn!

So as we head into the colder, windier months, remember to have a plan and then have a backup to that plan! Have the curiosity to keep expanding your horizons. Make sure you consider your growth as a pilot and your end goals. Because the best pilots don't just follow the plan, they learn from the detour.
