#### THE POH IS NOT A CHECKRIDE STUDY GUIDE, IT'S A DAY ONE TOOL

The POH Is Not a Checkride Study Guide, It's a Day One Tool

One of the most common habits we see in training is students treating the Pilot's Operating Handbook (POH) as something to crack open right before a checkride. While it might feel like a "test prep" document, the POH was never designed for that purpose alone. It is your aircraft's operating manual, and it should be part of your training from day one.

The POH tells you how your specific aircraft is meant to be operated, normal procedures, limitations, emergency actions, performance data, and system descriptions. These aren't abstract concepts or "good to know" facts; they are the foundation of safe decision—making in the cockpit. Waiting until checkride prep to review them means you're missing months of opportunities to build good habits and sound judgment.

Safety of flight always comes first. Knowing where to find information in the POH, and understanding how to apply it in real time, directly affects how you manage engine temperatures, fuel planning, weight and balance, abnormal situations, and emergencies. The more familiar you are with your aircraft, the less likely you are to rely on memory, assumptions, or "this is how we've always done it."

Make the POH part of your regular routine. Review amplified procedures, reference it during ground lessons, and bring it into post-flight discussions. Ask questions about what you see and how it applies to your flying. By the time checkride prep rolls around, the POH shouldn't feel overwhelming, it should feel familiar.

Good pilots don't memorize airplanes. They understand them. And that understanding starts on day one.
