REMINDERS FOR THE UPCOMING WEEK

- Make sure you fly all cockpits! We all love the G-1000 but, especially if you are considering CFI, get out from behind the glass. As well as for scheduling, make sure you diversify your cockpit management.
- Watch for wing covers and frost. DO NOT put the flaps down with the wing covers on.
- In the event of frost formation on your aircraft, you and your CFI will be put to work in helping remove it. Please make sure you have a line technician or a CFI helping you with frost removal. Teamwork is crucial here!
- Ground School! Get ahead of it. It will wind up extending your training and your costs if you are not staying consistent on ground school. For Private Pilot, best practice is to have the Knowledge Test completed prior to solo. However, we encourage it to be done well before then. You will be learning daily, so get that solid theoretical knowledge base as early as you can so it all makes sense.
