Recently, we've noticed three-hour bookings where flight times could have been completed within two hours. These extended bookings impact our ability to serve other students and utilize resources effectively. Pre-solo lessons should always be booked in two-hour blocks. If you require more time, please consult with your instructor and ensure the extended time is fully utilized. Being mindful of your scheduling helps keep the planes moving and training accessible for everyone.

REMINDERS FOR THE UPCOMING WEEK

- The Monday Night Study group will start up again on January 16th. Stay tuned for more details!
- Watch for wing covers and frost. DO NOT put the flaps down with the wing covers on.
- In the event of frost formation on your aircraft, you and your CFI will be put to work in helping remove it. Please make sure you have a line technician or a CFI helping you with frost removal. Teamwork is crucial here!
- Top of The Hour Reservations All GBA flights are scheduled on the hour, not the half-hour, to keep operations efficient. This helps ensure planes are fueled without delays, prevents instructor scheduling overlaps, and keeps training on track. It also simplifies office workflows, aligns with maintenance schedules for safety, and, most importantly, keeps Hailey from Hulking-out when the schedule doesn't line up perfectly! Half-hour reservations will be adjusted to the top of the hour. If you have any questions, feel free to chat with your instructor or call the office.
