CARBON MONONXIDE POISONING

As we embrace the winter skies with its crisp air and stunning sunrises, it's crucial to be mindful of potential hazards associated with our airplane's heating systems. While cold weather often brings improved aircraft performance, it also poses risks, especially concerning carbon monoxide (CO) exposure.

The Risk: Aircraft heaters, while effective, can pose a CO threat if there's a leak in the exhaust system. CO is odorless and colorless, deceiving your blood into bonding with it instead of oxygen, which can lead to hypoxia symptoms—ranging from headaches to impaired decision-making.

Preventive Measures:

- 1. Regular Maintenance: Our routine checks inspect and address any exhaust system issues.
- 2. Exhaust System Inspection: our mechanic pays special attention to ensure the exhaust system remains sealed and effective.
- 3.CO Detectors: All GBA aircraft are equipped with reliable CO detectors for an early warning system.

Action Steps: If you experience symptoms during flight, such as headaches or dizziness, consider CO exposure. Take immediate action by opening windows for ventilation, and landing as soon as safely possible.

Your safety is our priority. Stay informed, stay vigilant, and enjoy the winter skies responsibly.
