FLAT SPOTS ON TIRES: LET'S FIX THIS TOGETHER

Lately, we've seen a big increase in flat spots on airplane tires. The main culprit? Improper short-field landing technique. Let's break it down and fix it.

Short Field Technique: It's About the Approach

Short-field landings are all about a good setup and precise approach—not slamming the brakes the moment the wheels touch down. Airplanes aren't cars; braking too hard can cause serious tire damage, including costly flat spots and tube repairs.

Fly the Plane

Always remember to fly the plane, even during landing and rollout. Maintain control, use proper braking, and focus on hitting the right airspeeds and touchdown point. Aggressive braking won't win you points; it'll just wear out the tires.

Do Your Part

- Inspect Tires Pre-Flight: Roll the plane slightly and check for flat spots or damage.
- Report Issues: Notify us immediately if you see a problem.
- Review Technique: Practice good short-field landings with your instructor if needed.

Tires are expensive, and unnecessary wear affects everyone. Let's take care of our planes—and keep costs down—by flying smart and staying proactive. Fly safe!
