Flight school students nationally are facing a significant hurdle in their training journey due to the shortage of designated pilot examiners (DPEs). This scarcity has led to frustrating delays in scheduling checkrides, causing setbacks in completing training milestones. We hear you and know the frustration. Many of us (staff and instructors) have been in the same situation on our aviation journey.

As you navigate through your flight training program, it's crucial to remain patient and adaptable in the face of these challenges. Be realistic about your training timelines and stay in close communication with your instructors to adjust your plans accordingly.

Consider exploring alternative options, such as working toward your next rating while staying proficient with current requirements or the SIM for practice, to help stay on track despite the shortage. Our local DPEs are doing what they can to help, but right now demand far exceeds the examiners we have. Remember, perseverance and determination will ultimately lead you to success in your aviation pursuits.
