EFFICIENT ENGINE RUN-UP SUGGESTION

To help avoid congestion at the busy run-up area at 17L/R, we have a suggestion for conducting engine run-ups for our aircraft. By following these guidelines, we can keep the traffic flow steady and minimize delays for everyone.

Suggested Run-Up Procedure:

Location: South Ramp

We recommend performing your engine run-up on the south ramp instead of the crowded runup area. This location offers ample space and will help prevent backups.

Positioning:

- Taxi well down the south ramp of Atlantic, watching for any other ramp traffic, fuel trucks, etc.
- Ensure the tail of your aircraft is facing west.
- Be mindful not to block the entrance/exit to Taxiway Charlie.

Run-Up Procedures:

- Conduct your engine run-up procedures in this designated area.
- When you are ready to taxi, clearly communicate to ATC that you do not need to do a runup.

By adopting this approach, we can reduce congestion and improve operational efficiency, benefiting all GBA pilots. Your cooperation in following this suggestion will help make our flight operations smoother and more efficient.
