- Mixture control is everything. Lean for taxi, richen for take-off. Listen to your engine until you hear that happy purr.
- Climb nose lower and at at higher speed. The engine needs that air to cool. Watch your engine temps.
- Do not top off the fuel tanks. Extra weight means more power for take-off. We will
 not be topping off the aircraft. We will make sure you have plenty of fuel, but
 limiting top offs through the summer. If you self fuel, please do not top off.
- Get used to hot starts. Pull the POH and get familiar with the procedures.
